Dear colleagues and friends of the Global Geoparks Network,

The **GGN News Feed No 39 - March 2020**, has the latest news on Geopark activities worldwide which have been seriously affected by the Corona Virus (COVID-19) epidemic.

The GGN express solidarity to the Italian UNESCO Global Geoparks as Italy is facing a serious fight against Corona Virus (COVID-19) as we do to our colleagues in UNESCO Global Geoparks in the Republic of Korea.

China the most affected country shows encouraging signs that the fight against Corona Virus (COVID-19) will be successful. Encouraging signs there are also from the Republic of Korea. The number of newly-reported cases appears to be declining, and the cases that are being reported are being identified primarily from known clusters.

Corona Virus (COVID-19) is affecting day by day more and more countries creating severe problems to the society and economy.

According to the World Health Organization there is now (5th of March) a total of 95,265 reported cases of COVID-19 globally in 34 countries.

We understand that UNESCO Global Geoparks and their activities in geotourism and education are and will be strongly affected during the next weeks.

Important Geopark activities and International events have been canceled or postponed worldwide.

Among them some with direct relation with UNESCO Global Geoparks:

- the postponement of the 36th International Geological Congress decided to reschedule the Congress which rescheduled to 9 to 14 November 2020,
- the cancelation of International Tourism Fair ITB Berlin 2020
- the cancelation of the International Geosciences and Geoparks Programme IGGP Council and Open Session in which should take place the announcement of the 2020 applications of the aspiring UNESCO Global Geoparks
- the postponement of the European Geoparks Network Spring Meeting in Croatia which has been rescheduled to 12-15 May 2020.
- the postponement of the 209th UNESCO Executive Board Meeting in which should take place the endorsement of the UNESCO Global Geoparks Council decision for the new UNESCO Global Geoparks!

The GGN community collectively will find the proper ways to support each one of our members to overpass the consequences of the epidemic.

We support the statement of the World Health Organization "This epidemic can be pushed back, but only with a collective, coordinated and comprehensive approach."

Geoparks will continue as always working together and expressing solidarity, through networking, acting in a smart, inclusive and innovative way to promote Geoparks for the benefit of our local communities!

MENTORSHIP AND KNOWLEDGE EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

Dear colleagues we would like to inform you that UNESCO's International Geoscience and Geoparks Programme (IGGP) has just issued the call for aspiring and established geopark representatives to participate to the 2020 session of the Mentorships and Knowledge Exchange Programme with the financial and operational

support of UNESCO's two partner organizations, the Jeju Province Development Corporation (JPDC) of the Republic of Korea and the Global Geoparks Network association (GGN).

CALL FOR MENTORSHIP AND KNOWLEDGE EXCHANTE PROGRAMME APPLICATIONS

In 2019, UNESCO Secretariat launched the first pilot phase of the **Mentorship and Knowledge Exchange Programme**, which was successfully completed with the participation of 11 Mentors (established UNESCO Global Geoparks) and 13 Aspiring geopark representatives.

We are pleased to launch a new call for aspiring and established geopark representatives to participate to the 2020 session of the Mentorships and Knowledge Exchange Programme with the financial and operational support of UNESCO's two partner organizations, the **Jeju Province Development Corporation** (JPDC) of the Republic of Korea and the **Global Geoparks Network** association (GGN).

The objective of this programme is to further exchange knowledge and build capacity (SDG 4), with a view to developing new UNESCO Global Geoparks and creating new partnerships (SDG 17) between Member States by:

- supporting and training representatives of sites aspiring to join the UNESCO Global Geoparks by enhancing their knowledge of the design, development and management of UNESCO Global Geoparks (SDG 4);
- supporting the development of new UNESCO Global Geoparks and broadening their geographical distribution among Member States (SDG 8).

The current call is addressed to both qualified representatives of sites aspiring to join the UNESCO Global Geopark network ('Trainees') as well as experienced managers of UNESCO Global Geoparks ('Mentors') who will provide Mentorship and Knowledge Exchange opportunity to the Trainees.

The role of Mentors:

As Mentors, you will be an experienced UNESCO Global Geopark, willing to host Trainees from aspiring UNESCO Global Geoparks around the world, for an average period between one and two weeks.

During that period, you will immerse them in the day-to-day running of an existing UNESCO Global Geopark, share techniques and methods of Geopark development and management with them, including geological, educational, socio-economic and cultural aspects.

Please submit your expression of interest to the IGGP Secretariat by 23 March 2020 by indicating your preferred dates for hosting trainees in 2020.

Once the UNESCO Secretariat receives your interest, we will contact you for further modalities for the financial support that UNESCO will provide to the Host Geopark.

Application Process for Trainees:

If you are a representative of a site aspiring to join the UNESCO Global Geopark network and wish to benefit from the trainee programme with

financial support of UNESCO, please visit www.unesco.org/geoparks and send the following documents to the IGGP Secretariat before 23 March 2020:

- A brief geological description of your Geopark project (max. 1500 words);
- A brief evaluation of the state of your Geopark project and its objectives, challenges and other relevant aspects (max. 1500 words);
- A cover letter explaining your expectations of the exchange programme and how it might help you set up and manage your own UNESCO Global Geopark (max. 1500 words);
- Your availability to visit an established UNESCO Global Geopark as a trainee (indicating your preferred dates for visiting the site in 2020 for a maximum of two weeks);
- Your CV.

The present call will prioritize Trainees from developing countries and UNESCO Member States that have no more than one designated UNESCO Global Geopark. Women and early career participants are especially encouraged to apply.

The IGGP secretariat of UNESCO will select Trainees eligible for this exchange programme, arrange convenient dates up to 10 days exchange and cover all travel and accommodation costs.

CANCELLATION OF THE ITB BERLIN 2020

Just a few days before its opening the ITB Berlin 2020 was canceled due to coronavirus (COVID-19).

For more information please read the ITB Berlin 2020 announcement:

"ITB Berlin 2020 will not take place.

Due to the increasing spread of the novel corona virus COVID-19, the Federal Ministry of Health and the Federal Ministry of Economics have implied a cancellation of ITB Berlin 2020.

The responsible health authority of Charlottenburg-Wilmersdorf of Berlin has increased the requirements for the event to take place early this evening (18:27). Among other things, the authority orders Every trade fair participant must prove to Messe Berlin that they do not come from the defined risk areas or have had contact with a person from the risk areas. Messe Berlin is unable to implement all these requirements.

Messe Berlin has been pointing out for weeks that the decision to hold or cancel major events can only be made on the basis of the recommendation or instruction of the relevant authorities. Only these authorities have all the necessary information and expertise to draw the right conclusions".

CANCELLATION OF THE IGGP OPEN SESSION IN PARIS

Including the public presentation of Geopark new applications

Putting safety first is the UNESCO's priority, especially in this uncertain and rapidly evolving situation.

This latest information is rather worrying. The risks and uncertainties associated with corona virus spread calls for precautionary measures, especially with people travelling across the world.

In light of this challenging un-predictable health situation, after several consultations with relevant services, it is with deep regret that the UNESCO Science Sector have taken the decision for the cancelation of all Science related meetings during March

Thus the **IGGP Open Session** and the presentation of the New Applications for UNESCO Global Geoparks is cancelled.

1st UNESCO GLOBAL GEOPARKS YOUTH FORUM

Jeju island UGGp, Rep. Of Korea - 18 September 2020

The GGN Executive Board in collaboration with the UNESCO Global Geoparks Secretariat decided the establishment of a new activity the UNESCO GLOBAL GEOPARKS YOUTH FORUM.

The main purpose of the UNESCO GLOBAL GEOPARKS YOUTH FORUM is to offer young people an opportunity to engage more concretely in the preparation of the philosophy mandate and activities of the UNESCO Global Geoparks, elaborate their contribution to the debates of the 10th International Conference on UNESCO Global Geoparks and foster their commitment to the realization of the future they want, being actors of change in their territories. They will elaborate their proposal for actions contributing to the UNESCO Global Geoparks strategic framework for action 2020-2024, to address heritage protection, natural hazards mitigation, climate change and sustainable development in general.

Each Country hosting UNESCO Global Geoparks will be represented in the YOUTH FORUM with youth delegates engaged with UNESCO Global Geoparks that believe in their power of making changes and aim to become influential within their communities.

The 1st Assembly of the YOUTH FORUM will take place in parallel with the 10th International Conference on UNESCO Global Geoparks which will take place in Jeju island, Republic of Korea in September 2020.

Participants need to be aged from 18 to 24 years (according to UN/UNESCO Youth designation), showing their engagement with UNESCO Global Geoparks:

- in their respective living/working contexts territories and communities already included in the UNESCO Global Geoparks
- on issues related to Geological Heritage conservation, climate change adaptation, natural disaster mitigation, geo-tourism and sustainable territorial development.

Participants can be Geopark staff, Geopark partners, University researchers, phd candidates, university students or school students with clear engagement through their research or educational activity. Observers may include Youths from Countries hosting aspiring UNESCO Global Geoparks.

GGN - National Geopark Fora or Committees are responsible to nominate the representative of each country in the UNESCO Global Geoparks YOUTH FORUM and shall cover the expenses for their participation in the UNESCO Global Geoparks YOUTH FORUM meetings.

If a country wishes to nominate more representatives for the UNESCO Global Geopark YOUTH FORUM then the youth representatives of a country consist a country team with one vote at the UNESCO Global Geopark YOUTH FORUM meetings.

In case that a country (especially those with one Geopark) has difficulty to cover the expenses of the youth participation in the GGN YOUTH FORUM, can use the grant policy of the Conference or ask for support from GGN.

The Operational Guidelines of the 1st YOUTH FORUM have been agreed at the 64th GGN ExB meeting on December 10th, 2019.
