The course was attracted by more than 100 delegates from UNESCO Global Geoparks, Aspiring Geoparks, technical institutions and related companies.





















Modonie UGGp (Italy)

It is offered in 7 languages: English, French, Chinese (Mandarin), Spanish, Arabic, Hindi, and Indonesian




Forum of Volcanic Rocks and Geoparks in Volcanic Area
